LAW AND SOCIETY MAJOR, B.A. – 2003-2004

To qualify for admission into the Law and Society major, students must first complete the following pre-major courses in Area A with a UC grade-point average of 2.5 or higher. The four additional courses in Area B will not be included in the pre-major GPA calculation but must be taken for a letter grade and will apply to the overall major GPA. Students may declare a Pre-Law and Society major after they have completed at least one Area A course from the pre-major with a grade of “C” or better. Acceptance into the pre-major does not guarantee admission into the full major. Upon satisfactory completion of the pre-major courses and grade requirements, students must complete a change of major petition, available in the Law and Society Undergraduate Office. Courses in Area B need not be completed prior to the declaration of the full major. Note: Students will not be allowed to take upper-division Law and Society courses until they are in the full major.

MAJOR REGULATIONS

- PREREQUISITES** Check the *General Catalog* for the prerequisites to all listed courses.
- P/NP GRADING OPTION** *Up to 8 u. of Law and Soc 192 (P/NP required) may be applied to the major. All other major courses, including those applied to the major from other departments, must be taken for letter grades.
- SUBSTITUTIONS** In the major requirements permissible only by petition to the department chair and dean.
- RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS** At least 20 UD units in major while in residence at UCSB
- G.P.A. REQUIREMENTS** At least 2.0 overall average in a) all UD major courses; and b) all major courses (Prep and UD) while in UC.
- DOUBLE MAJORS** With the approval of each department chairperson, up to a total of 8 units may be applied simultaneously to both UD majors.
